A Rededication

On April 28th, the Staten Island Number 1 Detachment was rededicated to be the Sgt Angel Mendez Detachment in honor of a Staten Island Marine who was awarded the Navy Cross posthumously for saving his platoon commanders life and losing his own in the same action in Vietnam. The detachment officers found him in a poorly marked grave on the grounds of an old orphanage Angel once attended. After arranging for a proper head stone and contacting his family the detachment changed it's name to honor him in a ceremony that included the alumni from the orphanage, his sister, the officer he saved, local elected officials, representatives from every veterans group on Staten Island, local school children and members from other MCL detachments in the metropolitan area. In all 160 people attended this momentous event.

This detachment has been doing this activity for 16 years with no fanfare.






Our members do many things that do not always get in the Ground Pounder. Many times there are no photos, or they just don't think it's worth putting in but I disagree.
